

This is just a heads up to let you all know the *tentative* digging schedule for Fall 2017. This and the updated application are not yet available, but I will email everyone once they are finalized!

- Digging 5 days per week
- Thursdays thru Mondays
- Beginning Thursday, October 5th

The Montbrook Site is very productive and almost all volunteers will find some fossil specimens on their first day. The most commonly found fossils are bones from the shell of freshwater turtles and vertebrae, spines, scales, and skull bones of fish, including gar, catfish, snook, and drum. Fossils of alligator, birds, and mammals are also found, but less frequently.

Volunteers must be at least 15 years old. Volunteers from age 15 to 17 will be accepted, but must be accompanied by an adult sibling (18+ years old), or a parent or guardian.

Volunteers must be physically fit enough to work outdoors for several hours and be able to walk up and down irregular slopes. Be aware that the site is in direct sunlight and sandy. We will have a porta-potty at the site.

Volunteers can work just a single day, a few days, or a regular schedule one or more times a week. There is no limit to the number of times a volunteer can work at the site.

Volunteers are more than welcome to drive themselves or carpool to meet us at the fossil site. We can sometimes drive about 5 volunteers in the museum van but we need to plan this in advance.

WORK SCHEDULE

Field work typically begins at **10:00 AM** and continues through the day until about 4:30 PM. Plan your arrival time so that you will not get there much earlier than 10:00 AM. You can begin work anytime of the day between 10 AM and 1:30 PM. You will be expected to work for at least 3 hours (not counting if you break for lunch).

RAINOUTS

We will contact you via email in the event of a "rainout" and to schedule a make-up day. This decision will normally be made the day before. If you do not receive an email from us, assume that we will be digging at the site, even if rain is forecasted for that day. If it begins to rain heavily while we are digging, we may have to stop for the day.

WHAT TO BRING AND WEAR

The museum will provide all necessary digging tools, field equipment, and supplies for collecting fossils. Volunteers

should bring their own water, hats, gloves, sunscreen, cushions or towels to sit/kneel on, any special medication items, and food. Wear comfortable clothing that corresponds to the weather forecast. Wear shoes instead of sandals or flip-flops. Cameras of all types are welcome at the site.



Volunteer In the Collection

If you are interested in preparing specimens out of plaster jackets, screen washing, gluing bone fragments back together, or helping with the cataloging process. You can volunteer to work with the fossils back at the lab. Because of the time invested in training volunteers, we can only accept those who can work at least 3 hrs/week, for a min of 6 weeks. Volunteers must be at least 18 yrs old (or full-time UF student). Normal work hours for volunteers are between 8:30am and 5pm, Monday - Friday. 
Ancient DNA offers new view on saber-toothed cats' past

Researchers who've analyzed the complete mitochondrial genomes from ancient samples representing two species of saber-toothed cats have a new take on the animals' history over the last 50,000 years. The data suggest that the saber-toothed cats shared a common ancestor with all living cat-like species about 20 million years ago. The two saber-toothed cat species under study diverged from each other about 18 million years ago. (for the rest of the article go to www.sciencedaily.com)

This got me to wondering just how sabre-toothed cats were related to modern cats. Turns out they were closer to hyenas and civets than cats. Also the "sabers" were a result of convergent evolution in the different lineages.



Directions: The trip will take approximately 2 hours from Orlando to Vulcan Mine. Be sure to allow for extra time to stop at a restroom before you get there.

From Orlando take Hwy. 50 west (or the 408 west to the FL Turnpike, take exit 272 and then continue west on Hwy. 50) to Brooksville. Follow 50A/98 North through Brooksville and turn right on Ponce De Leon Blvd. (Hwy 98 North). Go approximately 10 miles. Vulcan/Cemex will be on your left. The address is 16313 Ponce De Leon Blvd, Brooksville, for those of you who want to download a map.

If you follow the truck route for Hwy. 50, you have to turn right onto 41, and then take the fork to the left to hook up with Ponce De Leon Blvd/98. There are several fast food places on 41 where you can take advantage of the bathroom facilities. Be sure NOT to keep following 41 north. You want to take 98 north from Brooksville.

This is mostly surface collecting with occasionally a little digging to pry out a specimen. Bring a small trowel or screwdriver or rock hammer, and a bucket to put your fossils and rocks into. You may want to bring small containers and tissue for fragile fossils.

Wear a hat, sturdy shoes, long pants (some of the rocks are sharp), and sunscreen. Bring lots of water and/or drinks and some snacks or lunch to eat.

We find mostly echinoids and sometimes sea urchins, pieces of bone, or other fossils are found. We also find chert rocks. This is the material that the Indians used to make their arrowheads and tools.
